OVERVIEW

This qualification is for those interested in developing a career in Health Sector for the award of National Skills Qualifications (NSQ). It is aimed at producing an Assistant Traditional Medicine Practitioner at NSQ Level 1 with the competencies necessary to support formal Traditional Medicine to provide basic health care services, complement existing Primary Health Care (PHC) services, and provide first aid in times of medical emergencies and preparation of Traditional Medicines.

This qualification is subject to review as and when the need arises.

QUALIFICATION PURPOSE

This qualification is designed for individuals who are interested in developing a career as an Assistant Traditional Medicine Practitioner.
